#### **Statement of Equality**

We have carefully considered and analysed the impact of this policy on equality and the possible implications for pupils with protected characteristics, as part of our commitment to meet the Public Sector Equality Duty (PSED) requirement to have due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations.

#### **Purpose**

Our Policy has been created with health and safety, value for money and practicality at its heart. It has been designed to ensure students wear clothing conducive to a successful learning environment. It is important that our students feel a sense of belonging and take pride in their personal appearance.

### Costs and availability

Under the School Admissions code 2014, the school will ensure that policies around school uniform will not discourage parents from applying for a place for their child.

Chantry Community Primary School is committed to fulfilling the DFE's recommendations on costs and value for money. Every care is taken to ensure that our uniforms are affordable and that the best value for money is secured through reputable retailers.

Chantry Community Primary School will not amend uniform requirements regularly and considers the views of parents and students when considering changes to the uniform.

## **Religious Clothing**

Some religions and beliefs require their members to conform to a specific dress code. Chantry Community Primary School does not discriminate against any religion or belief; however, the school



must weigh the needs and rights of individual students against cohesion and health and safety concerns of the entire school community.

Parents concerns and requests regarding religious clothing are dealt with on a case by case basis. The school will consider such requests sympathetically.

#### The Role of Governors

The Governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the uniform policy in each school. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the Governors responsibility to ensure that the school uniform conforms to regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy enables students to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, practical and easily accessible.

#### Requirements

Our school uniform is a mixture of red and grey. Most items can be bought from high street shops and additionally, we always have a stock of good quality used items. Please let a staff member know in confidence if you are struggling with any aspect of the school uniform and we will do our best to support.

#### **Uniform:**

- Grey skirt/pinafore dress or tailored shorts or trousers (not jogging bottoms or leggings)
- A red gingham checked or striped dress can be worn when the weather is more favorable
- White shirt or blouse
- Red v neck cardigan/sweatshirt Chantry logo or plain
- White/black/grey socks or grey/black/red tights
- School tie
  - o Reception to Year 3: Elastic tie
  - Year 4-6: Tie



Please note that skirts should be an appropriate length and of a style which allows your child to sit comfortably on the floor. Plain black leggings are only permitted to be worn underneath a skirt or dress in extremely cold weather or for religious reasons. A long sleeved plain white top is permitted to be worn under a shirt for the same reasons above.

#### **PE Kit**

- Black or red shorts
- Plain t shirt in team colour no logos or markings other than the Chantry logo if desired
- Black jogging bottoms or leggings in cold weather
- Plimsolls or trainers

Children are able to wear their red school cardigan or sweatshirt over the t shirt

All children are expected to come to school in correct PE on the day of the PE session (s) for the class.

## **Swimming**

- A one piece swimming costume is required
- Swimming hats and goggles are optional
- A towel is required

#### **Footwear**

All children are required to wear **plain black** shoes, trainers or boots. For health and safety reasons platform soles, high heels and open toe sandals are not permitted. Plain black boots with a low heel can be worn in the winter or when the weather is poor. If boots are worn, children may be asked to change into plain black shoes or plimsolls in the building.

#### **Aprons**

It is the responsibility of the parent to provide an apron or old shirt to remain in school for messy activities.
